



## TOUR HISTORIC CRAGFONT

Tour the house of General James
Winchester, veteran of both the
Revolutionary War and the War of 1812.
Two-story porches, a second-story
ballroom, and elegant gardens highlight
this historic site. A family cemetery is
located on the grounds. A Civil War
Trails marker is on-site.



### **TOUR HISTORIC WYNNEWOOD**

One of the largest log structures in
Tennessee that was erected in 1828, this
house was owned by the Wynne family. A
local natural spring made it a popular resort
destination in the 19th century. Wynne
descendants later participated in the Civil
War and a Civil War Trails marker is on-site.



Eat lunch in the lovely event space at Rose Mont, followed by a tour of the former home of the famed Judge Jo Conn Guild, who was heavily involved in thoroughbred racing and breeding. He was briefly imprisoned during the Civil War and a Civil War Trails marker is on-site.



# HISTORIC GALLATIN SQUARE & TROUSDALE PLACE

This antebellum city house was the home of former governor William Trousdale, also known as the War Horse of Sumner County for his extensive military background. The house is located in downtown Gallatin and its historic Square, established in 1802 as the seat of Sumner County.

## GALLATIN CITY CEMETERY WALKING TOUR

Established in 1818, the Gallatin City
Cemetery is an exquisite example of a 19th
century southern cemetery where several
prominent Tennesseans are laid to rest
along with other storied individuals. It also
houses one of the only Mexican-American
War memorials in the United States.



## DINNER & LIVE ENTERTAINMENT AT HISTORIC STONEWALL

Enjoy a catered meal in this stunning 1833 house that was once part of a local college campus in downtown Gallatin. Music of days gone by fill the air during dinner, setting a scene guests will never forget!



### TOUR HISTORIC COLD SPRINGS SCHOOL WITH CLASSROOM EXPERIENCE

This building was originally constructed in 1857 as a one-room school and meetinghouse but was converted into a military hospital during the Civil War. The school was also later used as church, farm building, private residence, and now a museum for all to tour.



# LUNCH AT 5 CHEFS & THE SHOPPES AT OCCASIONS

Eat lunch at the popular 5 Chefs restaurant, once featured in Southern Living Magazine, that is located in a old farmhouse near the heart of downtown Portland. Also enjoy shopping at their in-house retail store, The Shoppes at Occasions!

## VISIT HISTORIC MANSKER'S STATION

Mansker's Station is an authentic reproduction of a 1779-era forted station from early Tennessee frontier history. Re-enactors recreate a variety of living history demonstrations for guests to experience, like the live blacksmithing operation and wood carving at the site!



## **TOUR HISTORIC ROCK CASTLE**

This is General Daniel and Sarah Smith's circa 1784 home. The General acted as surveyor for this frontier, produced the state's first map, and is credited with naming the state of Tennessee! Historic Rock Castle sits on beautiful lakefront acreage in Hendersonville. The Smith family cemetery is located on the grounds. A Civil War Trails marker is located on-site.



Cliff Ernst purchased his first collector car in the mid-1970s and he's never stopped! He is recognized for having one of the most impressive collections of Yenko Chevrolets, and also has Corvettes, Impalas, Packards, factory super-charged Thunderbirds, Shelbys, and more!
